# THE STRASBOURG INTERNATIONALS BECOME A WTA 500 TOURNAMENT, FROM 2024!

**Tennis Association)** This Tuesday, 27<sup>th</sup>, the WTA (Women's June announced direction strategic circuit new and structure, upgrading the WTA Strasbourg's tournament to a WTA 500 tournament.

Established in 1973, the WTA is initiating a calendar reform this year, aimed at fostering sustainable, long-term growth for women's tennis. This undertaking serves to provide fans, sponsors, and broadcasters with a compelling narrative that embodies the organization's core values: equality, education, leadership, health, and well-being. It includes an unequivocal commitment to equal prize money at all WTA 1000 and 500 events.

The WTA Strasbourg's tournament, in parallel with the WTA 250 tournament in Lyon, has successfully applied for a WTA 500 license, set to come into effect from 2024.

With this upgrade, the WTA 500 Strasbourg's tournament will be **the 3**<sup>rd</sup> **tournament in France** after Roland-Garros (Grand Slam) and the Rolex Paris-Masters (ATP 1000).

Strasbourg's successful bid was attributed to its **multitude of strengths**. Rooted in Alsatian territory **since 1987**, the tournament has become a reference point across various facets.

Annually ranked amongst the top tournaments in its category and reputed as the ideal preparation for Roland-Garros, the WTA Strasbourg's tournament stead-fastly promotes and respects significant societal values. For over a decade, the tournament has championed sustainable development, earning global recognition as the *«Green Tennis Event»*. More than just a sports competition, the WTA Strasbourg's tournament serves as a convergence point for the sporting and economic sectors.
